Potential hosts should consider the following details when planning a screening event for their group.

Audience

Hosts to convene an audience of 5 – 25 people

Venue

Hosts may use their home, or reserve an appropriate space such as a faith or club hall, community center, library, or other venue. Consider accessibility, capacity, seating, parking and restroom facilities.

Food & Beverage

Hosts may consider providing light refreshments, if appropriate for their event.
